

'JINX' FIRE ENGINE IN ANOTHER CRASH

by Cranston Heights Apparatus in Collision at Eleventh and Church.

Cranston Heights Fire Co's "jinx" engine, which overturned while responding to a fire last winter, killing several of its crew, figured in another accident, at Eleventh and Walnut streets this morning.

The apparatus, which was recently reconstructed, was being taken to the plant of the United States Fire Apparatus Company, at Eleventh and Church streets. Edward G. Punte, 304 South Union street, an employe of the apparatus manufacturing company, was driver.

As the apparatus proceeded east on Eleventh street, it collided at Walnut street with a Yellow Taxi, operated by William H. Fisher, 1221 French streets, and then swerved into a roadster, owned by Jerry Ayers, colored, of 306 East Eleventh street, which was parked at the curb at the southwest corner of Eleventh and Wilson streets.

All three vehicles were slightly damaged. No one was injured. The fire engine was being taken to the plant to have a bumper attached to the front when the bump occurred.
